

JOB DESCRIPTION Head of Mathematics

The Head of Mathematics will lead the Mathematics curriculum throughout the school and will primarily teach pupils in Years 6-8. The role will be responsible to the Headmaster. The following gives a broad outline of the main requirements of the post:

- Articulating a vision for excellence in students' learning in Mathematics.
- Developing policies and practices to impact on student progression.
- Monitoring and improving standards in Mathematics throughout the school.
- Being a class teacher responsible for all areas of the Mathematics curriculum.
- Planning, preparing and presenting lessons and homework that cater for the needs of the whole ability range within each class in accordance with school policy.
- Ensuring the effective and efficient deployment of classroom support, including the Maths teaching assistant.
- Challenging the school's more able pupils.
- Liaising with our Head of Learning Development.
- Being a Form Teacher when required and being responsible for the pastoral care of boys in the form.
- Preparing, marking and displaying work to facilitate positive pupil development.
- Meeting requirements for the assessment and recording of pupils' development.
- Encouraging good practice with regard to punctuality, behaviour, standards of work and homework.
- Preparing boys for Kent Selection Tests (11+) and senior school tests in Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning, and in Mathematics.
- Working with scholars to help them prepare for scholarship exams.
- Providing feedback to parents on pupils' progress at parents' evenings and other (often less formal) meetings.
- Staying up to date with changes and developments in the structure of the curriculum as directed by the school / external organisations
- Carrying out duties assigned and covering lessons as necessary.
- Liaising with colleagues and working flexibly.
- Leading assemblies when needed.
- Taking part in school events that may be run at weekends or evenings, such as Speech Day, Carol and Easter services.
- Teaching Saturday school once each term (Year 8 only).
- Organising and accompanying school trips and a residential trip if required.

Also:

- To attend INSET, twilight and staff meetings as required / appropriate.
- To run a club(s) to support the extra-curricular provision of the school
- Undertake any other tasks or duties that the Headmaster may reasonably assign.

Person Specification:

- A caring, enthusiastic, team player with good communication skills.
- Ability to support up to 13+ scholarship level.
- Experience in a similar setting would be an advantage, but not essential, in addition to appropriate qualifications.

This job description is subject to review in line with the developing needs of the school.
